1 Kings 19:9a, 11-13a. Psalm 85:9, 10, 11-12, 13-14. Romans 9:1-5. Matthew 14:22-33.

**NEWS & NOTES FROM FR. PETE JANKOWSKI AS WE CONTINUE CELEBRATING OUR CHILDRENS' SACRAMENTS**

Because of our crazy situation, we certainly have been getting creative in celebrating the sacraments for our students who have prepared for these moments the last few years. As the Stay-at-Home began in March, we were not permitted to celebrate First Communions and Confirmations at the times we originally scheduled.

Earlier this summer, we figured out a way at St. Patrick's to celebrate an outdoor First Communion Liturgy for the kids in Momence. Deciding that more folks could attend services when we celebrated them outdoors, we chose to utilize the Our Lady of Lourdes grotto (which folks have been upgrading the last few months) to celebrate baptisms, First Communions and our Confirmation liturgy on September 6<sup>th</sup> (which the bishop has permitted me to celebrate).

Over at St. Anne's, we have chosen to celebrate the special liturgies for our students outdoors as well, in our Pavilion (weather permitting). The First Communion Mass will take place on

August 15<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 a.m. and the Confirmation Liturgy will take place on August 16<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 a.m. (the Bishop has given me permission to celebrate that liturgy as well).

None of this would be possible if it were not for John Rehmer (DRE at St. Patrick's) and Kim Emerson (DRE at St. Anne's), both of whom have been exemplary models of faith and virtue at the parishes they both serve.

Sometimes we take our volunteers for granted, despite the fact that these folks invest more time and talent in the cause than we can ever know. I would ask you to say a prayer of thanks for John, Kim and those who have served the next generation of faithful parishioners these last few years. We are indebted to their kindness.



As a side note, I also am indebted to those who have taken up the call to "Martha Ministries" at our respective parishes. Our rectories and churches have benefitted so much because of this form of Christian service. I do not think the cupboards at St. Pat's had been cleaned in ages – it took our volunteers HOURS to clean up a much-needed upgrade in our parish! – Fr. Pete
